



















Waterfront



- A step by step development and change over time from a working harbour to a multifunctional waterfront
- An on-going development of new cultural and recreational nodes and hotspots towards creating a stronger recreational and cultural waterfront

Challenges

- The waterfront is dominated by non-public functions e.g. offices and service
- A disconnected waterfront promenade
- The waterfront promenade is frequently affected by unattractive layout and lack of recreational options
- Few connections across the harbour
- Traffic barriers separate the city from the water


Towards a high class cultural and recreational waterfront

- Creating new pedestrian and bicycling connection across the harbour to further strengthen the recreational hub / triangle
- New bridge along the waterfront at Frederiksholms Kanal to further strengthen the waterfront connection - promenade
- New cultural institution and attraction of Søren Kierkegaards Plads to further strengthen the cultural node
- Strengthen and restoring missing link along the waterfront e.g under Langebro connecting Islands Brygge to Christianshavn
- Improved pedestrian and bicyle access to Havnegade and Nyhavn - the Playhouse
- Improved water bus service and more stops to strengthen comfort and accessibility

Getting across - Pedestrian priority

First class pedestrian crossings

To promote easy and pleasant pedestrian linkages between the city, the Bryghus project and waterfront focus should be on signalising high pedestrian priority along the key routes Vester Voldgade and Frederiksholms Kanal especially at street intersections providing high quality pedestrian friendly crossing opportunities

- Direct and simple crossing position according to natural pedestrian desire lines
- Legible
 designated, wide and clearly marked
 crossings
- Convenient
 pleasant walking flow with good balance between
 walking and waiting, dedicated pedestrian signals
- Smooth
 no interruptions, ramps and dropped
 kerbs level out height differences
- Comfortable and safe refuges and medians provide stopovers and allow for more informal crossing



Traffic flows - How many?

Traffic volumes versus comfort

The more car traffic the more impact on the pedestrian environment generating a range of obstacles to overcome: barrier effects, complicated crossings, waiting times and unsafe situations.
